From the Archives – the 2009 Burton Long Weekend

Our intrepid reporter has tracked down one of the vintage helms who competed in a clinker boat at the now famous 2009 N12 Championships at Thorpe Bay. His identity has been kept secret to protect his family and crews.

Q – The results and the racing have been reported on back in the days of websites and emails but having been to Burton Weeks in the 1870s what was your overall opinion of the Burton Weekend thirty years later back in 2009?

A – Great venue, excellent sailing, and well organised – a classic fun event.

Q - The weather?

A – Ranged from the sublime to the ridiculous and all points between! It was reported that it was gusting Force 7 before the start on the Monday (we decided on discretion etc) and rumoured that the Race Officer was considering abandoning the Burton, and on the Saturday 2/3rds of the fleet failed to finish the second race within the time limit (luckily for us as we were last at the time!)

Q – What did they do for the social side all those years ago?

A – There was a barbeque on the Saturday night (real meat and proper salads!), fancy dress on the Sunday and the Burton Dinner on the Monday. It was great to see that the vast majority turned up in weird and wonderful attire for the boat name fancy dress (the Stumpies were worthy winners dressed as trees) – and some people were similarly dressed for the Dinner the night after as well.
