



Directions:

From the West (The Midlands, Cambridge, etc), follow the A14 East towards Felixstowe.

From London, take the A12 North towards Ipswich. At the intersection with the A14, proceed East towards Felixstowe.

Exit to North at the junction with the A137 (1st exit after the A12/A14 intersection) towards Ipswich Docks. (If you cross the Orwell Bridge, you have gone too far!)

At the roundabout at the bottom of the hill, turn right towards Shotley on the B1456. This road passes under the Orwell Bridge and follows the river bank before turning inland.

Proceed towards Woolverstone and once inside 30mph zone look out for signs to "Marina" on the left and follow them.

The Club is on the right at the end of the long drive which passes through the Marina upper yard.

Directions:

<u>From York</u> – A64 to Staxton, leave A64 at roundabout (second exit) and take road signed Filey and Muston. After Muston you will reach a T junction – ignore the road to the right signed Filey (if you take this road you'll be at the wrong end of the bay!) and turn left, signed Scarborough, and follow the road to the next roundabout (just after a level crossing). Turn right to Filey and follow the road into the town, following signs for the Country Park. At the roundabout take the first exit and then after about 50m turn left into the Country Park.

<u>From Scarborough</u> - A165 to Filey, then first exit (left) at first roundabout in the town. Left after 50metres- bends to Right into Country Park.

<u>IGNORE</u> the 'pay and display' machines (cheap rate parking is available from the club). Head through the park until you reach a shop. The slipway is on the right through the trees. Wait at the top for instructions on how to get your boat down to the beach.

Directions: Starcross is a small village eight miles south of Exeter on the west bank of the River Exe, and the Club is situated at Powderham point approx 2 miles from Starcross village on the Exeter side. (Look for the small S.Y.C signpost marker)

From the M5: Leave the M5 at Junction 30 Exeter. If coming from the North take the third exit; if from the South take the first exit, at the motorway roundabout onto a dual carriageway signposted Exeter and Dawlish A379. After approx 2 miles - look out! - filter left follow A379, road then filters into rhs traffic, stay in Ihs lane to Countess Weir roundabout, straight over, carry on over the 'lifting bridge' (crosses over the canal), watch for left filter lane to Dawlish A379 as you approach the large roundabout, filter and turn left, you will then pass under the Motorway viaduct, stay on the A379, straight over the "Swans Nest" roundabout, after approx two miles there is a slight blind left turn signposted Powderham (small SYC sign under) turn left here, (if you find yourself in Kenton village you missed the turn) carry on down this partial single track road past Powderham church (watch out for oncoming traffic on the bends!) and the Club is on your left, under the railway line, "mind your head as you pass under our bridge" and do check your car height before trying to go under; an Espace has about 15mm clearance!

GILL NATIONAL 12 SERIES 2006 APPENDIX TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Before a boat is eligible to compete in a race run under these Instructions she must have a valid measurement certificate and comply with the class rules.

The Helmsperson must be a full paid up member of the National Twelve Owners Association for the year of competition. (This condition will not apply for the 70th anniversary event at Northampton Sailing Club).

2 EVENT SCORING AND NUMBER OF RACES TO COUNT

The Low Point scoring system of RRS.Appendix A will apply. Ties will be broken in accordance with Appendix A, Section A8.1 and A8.2 The number of races to count will be determined by the number of races completed, as detailed in the table below: -

Races to count	4	3	2	2	1

3 SERIES SCORING SYSTEM AND NUMBER OF EVENTS TO COUNT

The Low Point scoring system of RRS. Appendix A will apply.

All references to race or races, in Appendix A. shall mean event or events, this modifies appendix A

Ties will initially be broken in accordance with Appendix A, Section A8.1

When a tie remains between two boats, the tie will be broken in favour of the boat with the best score in the last event in which the tied boats raced and scored differently. This wording modifies appendix A.8 and replaces A.8.2.

The number of events required to qualify for the series will be determined by the number of events run in the series, as detailed in the table below:

4 CHANGE OF BOAT

Points will be awarded to a helmsperson regardless of boat sailed within the series. However, no change of boat is allowed at individual events

5 SUBSIDIARY TROPHY QUALIFICATION

Admirals Cup: Open to the helm of any boat conforming to the decking and buoyancy rules pre 1st Jan 1996 (i.e. not self draining) Juniors: under 21 on the 1st January 2006.

Family Cup: members of the same family sailing together with at least one a junior.

6 PRIZES

GIII SPONSOF prizes will be presented to the winners of each event. Winners that have already been awarded an event prize will not be eligible for another in this series; the prize will be awarded to the next highest eligible entry

7 FINISHING

At the discretion of the Race Officer, boats that are on a different lap to that sailed by the leading boat when she finishes may be finished when they next cross the finishing line at the end of a lap.
