My thanks to all those who have been keeping an eye out for "first of" Vintage National 12s; a brief summary of where we are with the various boats which seem to be collecting in my barns!

Boat	Name	Status
1650	Smuggler	<p>Initial planking repairs by Brian Herring and subsequent tidying up by Tim Gatti. Re-launched at TVSC at the Vintage Open 2012 sailed by Allan Brunton and Tricia Peacock. 1664	Squid	<p>Collected from Chris Bailey of the CRDVA who had picked the boat up from Richard Roscoe. 2020	Starfish	<p>Collected from a garage in Nottingham and sailed on a number of occasions including opens at Olton Mere, Aldeburgh and Trent Valley, plus competed by Angus at the Thorpe Bay Burton. 2359	Shotgun	<p>This is a very strange "one-off" designed and built by Mike Nokes. Was in a rough state having been in his garden for many years but didn't take long to tidy up for sailing. Has been sailed regularly including at two Burtons, and NWNW plus a number of opens. Sported a winged rudder for a season. 2399	Mr Jones	<p>Collected from Richard White several years ago; decks required stripping down and re-gluing before use. Sailed (and nearly lost at sea) by Angus at the Weymouth Burton. Sailed at several TVSC opens and by me at Attenborough. Major hull problems were identified Easter 2012 and after stripping down hull and interior now with Tim Gatti for major repairs. 2403	China Doll	Just returned from planking repairs and re-spray (to original Wedgewood Blue). Entered for this year's Burton. Now sporting a carbon tiller and stock (copied from the original, but just a little lighter!) and carbon boom and dangly awaiting fitting. 2492	Whisper	Rescued from a field near Worcester. In appalling state with decking, buoyancy tanks and hull coming apart; the gunwales are rotten – but at least we have the original Needlespar (with no spreaders!). This is a long term project. 2750	Cheshire Cat	Not a vintage clinker but too important a boat to see lost to the class; and it's an original! Now collected from Gerry Ledger having been totally re-decked plus major repairs to the bow where water inside the front tank had rotted the bow and the bottom of the tank at the mast foot. 3192	Micro clipper	Ok so not strictly part of the vintage collection being an AC boat but this was the one that got me interested in "odd" boats.
